For the exhibition, we commissioned six Leicester/shire linked artists to creatively respond to their homes:

<u>Ellé Hill</u>: Ellé is a Leicester based photographic artist, often exploring tensions of time and technology through her work.

<u>Elliot Robert Lawrence</u>: An artist and designer who generates liminal spaces with artificial means. Utilising rendered structures and custom textures bordering on the cusp of recognition.

<u>Harry Garner</u>: Harry's work explores allusive narratives found in painting. Harry is fascinated with the idea that painting provides the information, but not the answers.

<u>Jessica Wilson</u>: As a multidisciplinary artist, *Jessica* has found that the exploration of language as a pivotal communicative method has led to an interest in understanding how to be understood.

<u>Masah Azar</u>: specializing in drawing and portraiture, *Masah* is particularly interested in exploring identity, interpersonal relationships, coming of age, and popular culture.

<u>Sammy</u>: Photographer of the imperfect image. Alternative processes and 100% experimental. Sammy likes to zig when everyone else zags.

Alongside the digital exhibition we will be releasing six prompts, written by the artists during the residency. These will be shared on our social media platforms and viewers will be invited to respond to them. Artistic responses by the *Attenborough Arts Centre's* young ambassadors, *Next Gen.Creatives* will also come to form part of the exhibition. We hope these prompts and the *'In Residence'* exhibition will encourage viewers to engage in a different, perhaps a more creative, way of looking at their homes.
