Topic 1: Zine, Self-publishing, and Sharing your Practice	Find out why everyone should create and publish their own zines. This topic includes a presentation on the benefits of zine making as a method for documenting creative practice, and an optional hands-on tutorial or workshop. As a result of attending this creative event, attendees will be inspired to make zines. For example, No Jobs in the Arts spoke about this topic at the University of Northampton and Sheffield Hallam University in 2024.
Topic 2: Tools for Effective Decision-Making: Choosing Between Creative Opportunities?	Discover how to evaluate and select the right creative opportunities. In other words, this topic will provide you with practical tools to avoid bad opportunities and make informed decisions with confidence. Talk content can include a follow-up discussion supplement. This workshop will introduce you to the resources and opportunities available in the creative community and share the experiences of No Jobs in the Arts directors.
